1 CALL TO ORDER

a) Roll Call

Roll call was taken of those present to the work session.

b) <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>

Mayor Gullette dispensed with the pledge of allegiance.

2 APPROVAL OF AGENDA

3 OLD BUSINESS

a) Public Works / Police Facility Updates

Regas provided the council and new board members current updates on the project noting no new actions have been taken on the project. Regas reported the building has been requested to 'flip-flopped' placing the public works department on the

westside of the building and police on the east. This change will need approval of USDA but will not take long to approve. Nothing further.

- b) <u>Liquor Store Remodel / Addition Updates</u>
 Regas and Melissa Gullette provided updates on the project.
- c) American Rescue Plan Act Funding Regas provided information on the ARP Funding to the board reporting no new
 business or actions needed at this time. New board members requested Regas
 provide more information and documentation from LMC. Regas will email out most
 recent information. Nothing further.
- d) <u>Blackduck Stumpjumpers Public Parking Lot Update</u>
 Regas provided updates on this project reporting acquisition of the property has been completed and the city is awaiting a draft of a long-term lease between the city and the snowmobile club. Nothing further.
- e) <u>Downtown Redevelopment Project Updates</u>

 Regas provided updates on the project reporting the demolition will not happen until 2022 but asbestos removal will begin late September.
- f) City Sales Tax Regional Significance Curt Meyer, Widseth
 Meyer presented to the board how his business will assist in drafting a regional
 significance report to assist with the approval of a city sales tax. Meyer requested the
 board members send him by email their ideas to be added to the listing of projects
 the city would like to be added to the regional significance report portion of the
 request. Meyer stated his team has a better understanding of what is covered and
 what is not. Regas will provide the board the current CIP adopted in 2018 and the
 email address of Meyer. Meyer stated he will begin on the draft in October and would
 have a good wish list formulated by the October or November work session. Nothing
 further.
- g) Ordinance Section 310.01 Council Pay Ordinance Amendment Draft
 Regas reviewed the proposed amendments to Ordinance §310 Salaries of Mayor and
 Council Members. The board discussed further amendments and Regas noted those
 for the first reading scheduled for October 11, 2021. Regas will post the public notice
 for the amendment. Nothing further.
- h) <u>Resolution 2021-01 Revision Standing Committees</u>

 Regas reviewed vacancies in standing committees and the board members adjusted those positions to support new board members. Regas will revise the resolution and provide it for approval on October 11, 2021.

4 NEW BUSINESS

a) 2022 General Fund Budget Preliminary Recommendation

Regas presented minutes from the Finance Committee's meetings to determine the proposed levy for 2022. Those topics discussed included the following: details of the proposed 2022 General Fund Revenue and Expenditure Budget(s); highlights for each General Fund department operating budget changes; the 2022 City Debt payments; and example of how the proposed levy increase affects a residential tax payer. Regas reported a proposed increase to the total levy over 2021 of 17.75% which presents an average increase to a tax payer of \$99 per residential home. Regas stressed the importance of how the increase over 2020 (pre-pandemic) is \$31 and that the 2021 budgets were kept low due in part to the pandemic and the uncertainty of the economy.

Council members discussed the proposed increase and its affect on city and budgets. Council members did not request changes to the proposed levy as it was presented by the Finance Committee.

b) Blackduck Golf Course - Capital Improvements & Purchases to consider

1. Rough Mower

2. Pump Drives improvements for irrigation system

Rough Mower - Erpelding reported to the board regarding a rough mower purchase for the Blackduck Golf Course. Erpelding discussed how the course needs a replacement rough mower and he researched a mower that more suitably supports the needs of the course. Erpelding suggests the city council discuss and approve a budget of a used mower (John Deer 1600) that he and Schwanke found several machines being sold on the internet with varied hours of use and price. Erpelding suggests pre-authorizing \$20,000 for a good used mower with low miles. Councilor Seitz recommended to be cautious on older equipment that may have maintenance issues and asked if the city completes all maintenance. Erpelding states he always requests maintenance records on machines he purchases.

Regas recommended the council pre-authorize a purchase of a used machine for a set price range that can be held with a small deposit prior to the October 11, 2021 council meeting so additional research can begin. Councilor Seitz asked if the purchase can wait until Spring or if new will be a better path. Erpelding stated the course could finish the season off with the existing mower but a plan must be put in place for replacement. Seitz was in favor of a used machine if the unit selected is well maintained for the short term.

Erpelding and Regas will work together to report to the city council prior to the next council meeting to find an appropriate mower with low hours and cost.

The topic of servicing the golf equipment was discussed in detail for whom is responsible for servicing mowers and equipment. Andersen reports he and his staff completes scheduled maintenance; notates dates of when filters are replaced on the parts; does not complete a maintenance or service log; and when repairs are beyond the scope of he and his staff the repairs are sent out to local repair shops and/or vendors like Toro are used.

<u>Irrigation Pump Drives -</u>

Andersen provided the city council with a quote from TORO to update the 40 year old clay valve system in the pump house which is the heart of the irrigation system. Andersen is requesting approval to update the system, and the estimated costs from TORO are \$7529.39. The board discussed approving the updates and requested scheduling the updates for 2022. Nothing further.

- c) <u>City of Blackduck Communications Policy recommended revisions</u>
 Regas presented a revision to the City of Blackduck Communications Policy recommended from the Personnel Committee. Regas stated revisions provide the city-provided cell phone or reimbursement amount with the addition of the Deputy Clerk position of \$40.00 (data and voice); and the deletion of the Public works staff as the Public Works Director has requested city-provided phones for that department. Nothing further.
- d) City of Blackduck Police Administration Agreement Robert Fraik
 Regas presented a draft of a Police Administration Agreement with Part-time Officer
 Robert Fraik. Regas reported Officer Fraik has agreed to fill the administration role of
 CLEO for the Blackduck Police Department that is required by state statute to retain
 a police department in the absence of a full-time Chief of Police. Regas provided the
 details of the agreement including compensation and recommended the City agree to
 the terms. The City Council board members did not have any issues with agreement
 but requested clarification the compensation would return to the part-time wage after
 the agreement expires. Regas stated that although that is already the agreement with
 Fraik it is her future recommendation the City of Blackduck revise the current wage
 for part-time officers for the department to assist in hiring and retaining experienced
 level officers in the future.
- e) <u>City Council Fall Tour of the City discuss and schedule</u>

Mayor Gullette requested newly elected officials work with Schwanke to have a 'tour' of city properties and other locations like the irrigation ponds and fields. Schwanke agreed to work with the council members on individual levels. Nothing further.

f) Chamber Golf Night - September 22, 2021 Mayor Gullette recommended all council members attend the Chamber Golf Night and Social.
