# u. Consent Agenda Items for further discussion

i. March 2023 Supplemental Bill Report - Liquor Store Invoice

Mayor Gullette requested clarification on the supplemental bill report for liquor store invoices. Regas reported there were invoices from liquor vendors that did not make it into previous council meetings for approval and required payment to have the department released from the state hold for liquor deliveries. Regas stated the payment is not normal as most invoices are included in the monthly bill batch. Gullette asked if the vendors are new to the city. Regas stated no.

# t. Final Approval - 2023-2024 LMCIT Workers Compensation coverage premium - City of Blackduck

Councilor Fredrickson asked for clarification as to why the premium increase was so much higher than 2022 and what was budgeted for 2023. Regas stated the City had

one claim in 2022 and reminded the councilor that LMCIT reported premiums could increase anywhere between 5-15% for 2023 and the City budgeted for a lower increase from the estimates and it was not enough. Regas discussed which departments of the city spiked for 2023 and noted the liquor spiked as well. Councilor Fredrickson stated it appears to be a combination of claims and cost increases. Regas agreed stating emergency management liability has increased in previous years.

#### 5. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND CITY STAFF

# 5.1. PUBLIC WORKS REPORT - MIKE SCHWANKE, PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR

## 5.1.1. Report -

Schwanke reports his staff is shuffling many departments right now opening Pine Tree Park; opening the restrooms at Wayside Rest Park; helping the Golf course get up and running with new door installs, cart maintenance, and irrigation; and relocating the maintenance building. Schwanke gave recognition to Girl Scout Troop 667 picked up trash and downed branches at wayside rest park. Schwanke reports Oscar Avenue is taking a beating this spring and would like the city council to keep it in mind to fund repairs to the road. Schwanke further states his department is loaned from the county department their patch trailer for no cost but the city only gets to use it when they are done using it. Schwanke states his department is aware of the roads in town that need pot holes filled and they will come back when the frost is out of the ground and fill with material to hold together what can be done.

# 5.2. LIQUOR STORE REPORT - SHAWNDA LAHR, DIRECTOR OF LIQUOR OPERATIONS

5.2.1. Report -

Lahr reports Chamber bingo went well and are done until Bash; Cinco de Mayo was well attended; staff is ready for Opening Fishing; a new menu is out with new pricing and items.

Mayor Gullette asked for an update on the beer cooler door. Lahr reports there are several moving factors to the door issue and getting the airflow corrected in the building and reducing the humidity in the building first before the door is serviced. Lahr states the installer of the cooler will not service it until the airflow issue is resolved first. Councilor Hamilton asked what needs to get done to resolve the humidity issue. Lahr states the square footage in the building is not supported by the existing cooling system and she is receiving quotes and reports from heating and cooling companies. Lahr states it is important to resolve the air flow issues correctly. Councilor Johnson asked why the system was not looked at when the remodel and addition was put in. Regas reported that when the city was considered the expansion project a feasibility study was completed of the entire building including the heating and cooling. Regas further stated that at the time of the study the costs of the heating and cooling were considered items that could be paid for outside the scope of the expansion, however due to supply chain issues and costs at that time only 1 cooling unit was installed and the other units still need to be addressed. Regas further stated the cooler door worked as specified when the expansion opened but the first summer the airflow issues happened.

# 5.3. GOLF COURSE REPORT - MISTY FRENZEL, GOLF COURSE DIRECTOR

# 5.3.1. <u>Council Approval Requested - Purchase of Work Top Refrigerator and MDH</u> shelving

Regas reports for Frenzel that the kitchen still needs a refrigerator and Frenzel has received a quote from Performance Foods for a worktop fridge and approved MDH shelf to finish. Regas reminded the board members that there is a work table on loan from a member in the kitchen and that the kitchen is in need of a fridge to keep the condiments in the approved area. Regas states that at this time condiments are being stored in the kitchen upstairs. Regas also states that the creation of the monthly Grill n Chill events was made to raise funding to offset the kitchen improvements.

Laurie Hamilton moved to approve the purchase of a worktop refrigerator and shelf from Performance Foods with delivery for \$2,386.10 Nicholas Seitz seconded the motion.

## 5.4. LIBRARY REPORT - KELLY HANKS, HEAD LIBRARIAN

# 5.4.1. <u>Kitchigami Regional Library Capital Appropriation Project - Miriam Osborn-</u> Dougherty

Osborn Dougherty was present to discuss an offer to purchase commercial property in the city to relocate the Blackduck Library. The property offered is from Chan Moon and is the old Moon Drug building. Osborn states the offer to sell the property is for \$25,000 with a potential lease to Moon for space to store his collector car and to lease space to the CRC. Osborn and Hanks have toured the building and see potential to provide enough space for the growth of the library. Osborn states there are needed updates to the building including an ADA restroom, retiling the floor, paint, etc. Council members discussed items such as the age of the building; cost for utilities; cost of current property taxes that would be removed from the levy; square footage of the whole building; occupancy and fire codes. Osborn is present to ask for permission to move forward with an offer to purchase with stipulations the building will be inspected prior to acquisition. Osborn states that with the reduced cost of this building the city would not need to sell its existing building to purchase another and there would be funding left over to renovate.

Councilor Fredrickson asked that the same building inspector that reviewed the old bank building provide the same service for this building. The council agreed the inspection was necessary to move forward.

Ronald Fredrickson moved to approve the service with Township & Range to inspect the building - Moon Drug Laurie Hamilton seconded the motion.
